The Annual General Meeting for the club took place in May and included the following updates:

- Election of the Executive Officers the membership voted to retain the following existing Executive: President: Derek Hatfield, 1st Vice President: Lauren Sharkey, 2nd Vice President: Lori Sullivan, Past President: Larry Sullivan, Directors: Andy Crowell, John Kajmowicz, and Jan Kajmowicz.
- Following the resignation of long-term treasurer Mary Hay, past secretary Ron English stepped in to fill the role. A new addition to the executive, Sarah Parna, was voted in to act as secretary. Stephanie Greaves and Wynne Williamson agreed to join as Directors.
- The membership voted to support some minor price increases to membership fees and bar prices. The executive shared some information on plans for future capital spending and long-term club maintenance to help explain the need for increased club income.
- Draft club policies were shared with the membership with the intent to have them officially adopted at the next AGM.
